

1. When Jewish soldiers fought to capture Israel, if a soldier captured and wanted to marry a beautiful non-Jewish woman, was he allowed to marry her right away? NO
2. Before he married her, she had to make herself look ugly. One way was by shaving all her HAIR
3. Another way was by letting something grow very long. What? HER NAILS
4. Another thing that made her look ugly was that she had to wear bad-looking CLOTHES
5. For how long did she have to make herself look ugly? ONE MONTH
6. During the month, who did she think about all the time? HER NON-JEWISH FAMILY
7. If after a month she said she wanted to become Jewish, could she? YES
8. How much longer did the Jewish soldier wait until he could marry her? ANOTHER TWO MONTHS
9. If she didn't want to become Jewish, the Jewish soldier had to send her back to her home. What was he not allowed to do to her? USE HER AS A SLAVE OR SELL HER AS ONE
10. Let's say that the following happened in the time of the Bait Hamikdash: two Jewish adults told a boy not to steal money, and then spend it buying meat and wine. But the boy did anyway. And then he ate and drank with other bad boys. Where did the parents have to bring their son? TO A JEWISH COURT
11. What was the boy's punishment? LASHES
12. If he did it again many times, where did the parents bring him? TO A JEWISH COURT
13. What was his punishment? DEATH
14. Why does the Torah say that such a boy had to be put to death? BECAUSE HE MAY GROW UP TO DO BAD THINGS LIKE STEALING, HURTING AND EVEN KILLING PEOPLE
15. How old did this boy have to be? 13 YEARS OLD TO 13 YEARS AND THREE MONTHS
16. If the boy was older or younger, could he have been put to death? NO
17. How many parents had to be living for him to be put to death? BOTH PARENTS
18. If one or both parents were deaf, blind, or they couldn't talk, could the boy have been put to death? NO
19. Some rabbis say that no boy was ever put to death for being so bad. If so, why does the Torah talk about it? SO PARENTS WILL KNOW TO TEACH THEIR CHILDREN TO DO THE RIGHT THING
20. If a Jew was put to death in the time of the Bait Hamikdash, his body had to be hanged. When was the body hanged and when was it taken down? IT WAS HANGED RIGHT BEFORE SUNSET AND TAKEN DOWN RIGHT AFTER SUNSET
21. When should a Jewish dead person be buried? ON THE SAME DAY HE (OR SHE) DIED

22. If you find something that someone lost, and you know who the owner is, what should you do? GIVE IT BACK TO THE OWNER
23. If you find something and someone comes up to you and says it is his, what does he have to do to prove that it is his? HE MUST DESCRIBE IT
23. If you don't know who the owner is, what should you do? TRY TO FIND THE OWNER
24. If you can't find the owner, may you keep what you found? YES
25. If you see a man putting things on a donkey, and you also see another man taking things off his donkey, and both men need your help, and you like both men, who should you help first and why? THE ONE TAKING THINGS OFF THE DONKEY SO THE DONKEY WON'T CONTINUE TO SUFFER WITH THE HEAVY LOAD
26. Are you allowed to ask him to pay you? NO
27. If you help a man put things on his donkey, are you allowed to ask him to pay you? YES
28. If you see a man putting things on a donkey, and you also see another man taking things off his donkey, and both men need your help, and you don't like the man who is putting things on his donkey, who should you help first? THE ONE PUTTING THINGS ON THE DONKEY
29. Why should you help him first? BECAUSE MAYBE YOU WILL BECOME FRIENDS
30. What kind of clothes are men and women not allowed to wear? MEN MAY NOT WEAR THE CLOTHES OF A WOMAN AND WOMEN MAY NOT WEAR THE CLOTHES OF A MAN
31. If you find a bird's nest, and the mother bird is in the nest with her baby birds, what must you do if you want to take the baby birds for yourself? SEND AWAY THE MOTHER BIRD
32. If you live in a home with a roof which people use, or you have a place in your house or yard where people might fall and get hurt, what must you build so people won't get hurt? A FENCE
33. ה' said in the Torah that only a certain kind of Jewish men could be soldiers in the Jewish army. What kind of men? TZADIKIM (very good Jews who study Torah and do the mitzvot)
34. In the time of the Bait Hamikdash, if a non-Jewish slave worked for an owner who didn't live in Israel, and the slave ran away from the owner and came to live in Israel, what happened to that slave? HE WAS FREED AND BECAME JEWISH
35. Let's say that a Jew owned a field in which he grew fruits, vegetables or he owned a vineyard in which grapes grew. And let's say he paid Jews to pick the fruits, vegetables and grapes. Were the workers allowed to eat any of the food while they were working? YES
36. Were the workers allowed to take some of the food home? NO
37. What is *lashon ha-ra*? SAYING SOMETHING BAD ABOUT SOMEONE

38. Miriam was Moshe's sister. She got *tzo-ra-at*. What was that? A SICKNESS IN WHICH THE SKIN TURNED WHITE
39. Why did Miriam get *tzo-ra-at*? SHE TALKED LASHON HA-RA
40. Are Jews today allowed to talk *lashon ha-ra*? NO
41. Let's say a store owner sells candy by the pound. He has a scale which is used to weigh the candy. The scale is broken. Is he allowed to use it to weigh the candy? NO
42. Is he allowed to keep the broken scale in his store? NO
43. Why does ה' in this parsha tell Jews to hate Amalek? WHEN THE JEWS LEFT MITZRA-YIM (EGYPT), THE PEOPLE OF AMALEK ATTACKED THE THEM FOR NO REASON
44. The Torah says not to wear *shatnez*. This is that Jews may not wear two kinds of materials in the same garment. What are they? LINEN AND WOOL
45. Jewish boys and men must wear *tzitzit*. How many corners does a garment need before *tzitzit* must be put on it? FOUR
46. When must Jewish boys and men wear *tzitzit*? ONLY DURING THE DAY
47. If you lend Shimon \$10, and you ask him to pay you back \$11, what is the extra money called? INTEREST
48. Are you allowed to ask Shimon to pay you interest? NO
49. Is Shimon allowed to give you interest? NO
50. If you own a business, and you have people working for you, and you promise to pay them every Friday, when Friday comes, what must you do? PAY THEM
